FROM THE DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS

For the past 3 years, we have placed a focused effort on praying for spiritual awakening across Knox County. We invite churches to form prayer groups focused solely on spiritual awakening, set aside time each month to invite church leaders to come together in praying for spiritual awakening, and produce resources to help guide people in praying for spiritual awakening. Over the past year, I have become aware of prayer efforts across our city and county from churches both inside and outside our Association of churches. Frequently, I have exciting conversations with people about their own desire to see spiritual awakening take place.

We are hearing that the Spirit of God is moving in mighty ways in places across the world such as Sub-Saharan Africa, parts of Asia, South America, and even in places such as Pakistan. Recently, we are hearing about spiritual awakening taking place on college campuses near our city. On the campuses of Asbury University and Lee University we are reading of revival among college students that is spreading across our area. Just this week, students at the University of Tennessee met to pray for spiritual awakening here in Knoxville. In many areas near us, a mighty movement of God is taking place.

When I hear these reports, I am "amazed" by the movement of God's Spirit. In Scripture, we read that people were often "amazed" by what they heard, saw, and experienced with Jesus Christ. Over 32 times Scripture records that people were "amazed" by Jesus. Yet, only 2 times in Scripture do we read that Jesus Himself was amazed. In Luke 7, Jesus was "amazed" at the faith of the Centurion. And then in Mark 6, Jesus was "amazed" at the lack of faith by the people. That's it – once He was amazed by their faith; and once He was amazed by their lack of faith.

It seems in our culture today, we are more cynical and critical than we are "amazed." In our culture today, would Jesus be more amazed by our faith, or our lack of faith? Sadly, I think we know the answer.

Let's once again be amazed at what God can do and is doing. Let's live in such a way that He will be amazed by our faith. Let's Live it out. Everywhere. Everyday!


