### JAPANESE PEOPLE

Japan is the eleventh most populous country and one of the most densely populated and urbanized countries in the world. It is an island nation located in the northwest Pacific Ocean. It is a leading economy among the nations of the world. The greater Tokyo area is the largest metropolitan area in the world with almost 40 million people. Japan is well known for it's culture, art, cuisine and beautiful people. Tourism numbers are high both for tourists coming into Japan and Japanese traveling to other world destinations. Japan has many well recognized international companies. This includes the Denso plant in Maryville. This plant brings many Japanese families to work and live in our area. Others come to East Tennessee for work and education. The majority of Japanese follow Shinto or Buddhism in their religious practices. Christianity is about 1.5% of Japan's population making it one of the largest unreached people groups in the world

- Pray for Christians to realize the presence of Japanese people around them and to reach out to them with love and the gospel message.
- Pray for the Holy Spirit to draw Japanese people here and in their home country to the gospel
